- authorised the absence of Hon Judith Collins KC from New Zealand, from 28 April to 2 1 May 2025, to travel to Manila, Republic of the Philippines to sign the New Zealand – Philippines Status of Visiting Forces Agreement;
- agreed that she be accompanied by two staff members from her office, one of whose costs 2 will be met by Vote Defence;
- approved the estimated expenditure of up to \$25,252.50 for the travel expenses of the 3 ministerial party, as a charge to Vote Internal Affairs (Members of the Executive – Travel);

- ence I seek Cabinet approval to travel to the Republic of the Philippines from 28 1 April – 2 May to sign the New Zealand-Philippines Status of Visiting Forces Agreement (SOVFA).
- 2 The Prime Minister has approved the travel in principle, and House leave is not necessary as Parliament will not be sitting during this period.

Purpose of Travel

3 In Manila I will meet with Secretary of National Defense Teodoro and we will sign the New Zealand-Philippines SOVFA. A significant deliverable in our bilateral relationship, this timing will enable the SOVFA to be ready for consideration by the Philippines Senate, following the 2025 mid-term elections on 12 May. s6(a), s9(2)(g)(i)

sence I recommend that Cabinet note this report on my travel from 28 April – 2 May 2025 to the Republic of the Philippines under my Defence portfolio.

Report

- During my visit to Manila, I signed the New Zealand-Philippines Status of 1 Visiting Forces Agreement (SOVFA) and called on Philippine President Ferdinand Marcos Jr at Malacañang Palace. I also held a bilateral meeting and joint press conference with Philippine Secretary of National Defense Gilberto Teodoro, met with Senate President Francis Escudero, and laid a wreath at Rizal Park.
- 2 At the New Zealand Residence, Secretary Teodoro and Laddressed 100 guests (from defence and other government departments, academia and the diplomatic and New Zealand communities) at a reception to mark the SOVFA signing.
- 3 My engagements in Manila were warm and the conversation was free-flowing, especially with Secretary Teodoro. Regional security issues s6(a) were discussed in all my meetings. The alignment between New Zealand and the Philippines as small countries with like-minded values and a commitment to upholding the rules-based order and UNCLOS was clear.
- 4 I took the opportunity to reiterate that, in the face of heightened geostrategic competition, defence cooperation has never been more important. The SOVFA was recognised as important from a strategic perspective, as well as operationally. I described the SOVFA as a "two-way street" where it could facilitate humanitarian assistance and disaster response efforts. A key theme was the shared challenges in respect to natural disasters, and how the SOVFA would build familiarity between forces to enhance interoperability in s6(a) future engagements

My visit and the SOVFA signing received extensive, positive media coverage, including making the front page of leading daily newspapers in Manila and was widely reported on the internet and social media. This spoke to the significance of the signing, given Japan's Prime Minister was visiting Manila at the same time.
